Every year between January and April, the great gray whales travel thousands of miles from the North Pacific to the protected warm bays of Baja California Sur to breed and give birth.

It is in those months when this species, is spotted curiously approaching the boats that patrol the area.

Their playful and social behavior, surprises all visitors, as they approach boats in an incredible display of curiosity. Very often they socialize with visitors, who can take the opportunity to touch them, hug them and even kiss them, always prioritizing having a respectful interaction.

We will enjoy three days contemplating these ocean giants in what will definitely be an unforgettable experience.

DAY 1: TRANSPORTATION FROM CABO OR LA PAZ

The adventure is going to begin. We will pick you up at the appointed time in the morning, either in Cabo or La Paz, to start the way to a magical place away from civilization, hidden in the peninsula of Baja California Sur, Magdalena Bay.

This wild destination is characterized by its enormous environmental importance due to the large number of land and marine species that reside there, and not in vain has become a destination frequently visited by professional photographers and explorers of major producers, such as National Geographic, BBC or Discovery Channel, among others.

The bay is a 5 and a half hour drive from San Jose del Cabo Airport and 3 hours from La Paz Airport, on the Pacific Ocean side.

We will arrive at the hotel at sunset, with enough time to relax, unpack, receive a briefing for the next days' activities, and have dinner at the hotel's restaurant.



DAY 2: SIGHTING AND GLAMPING

We will wake up early in the morning to have breakfast at the hotel, and afterwards we will go sailing to enjoy one of the most spectacular underwater events in the world.

We will enter the Magdalena Bay waters to enjoy the marvels of these giants of the ocean. We will try to look for the most sociable whales each day, and will try to communicate with them by whistling, singing, waving softly or splashing them. We will spend about 6 hours aboard the boat enjoying this unique and exclusive underwater spectacle of this place, which will delight the most demanding and adventurous travelers.

By mid-afternoon, we will move to our accommodation for the next two nights, an exclusive camp on a deserted island, Magdalena Island. There we will enjoy exploring the island, kayaking and paddle boarding in the waters of the bay, or relaxing in front of the beach in a unique environment.

Finally, we will enjoy an a la carte dinner with the freshest and most delicious products of the region.



DAY 3: SIGHTING AND GLAMPING

Once again we will wake up early in the morning to have breakfast at the camp and we will leave as soon as possible to enjoy this unique event that nature gives us at this time of the year.

We will sail through the calm waters of the bay to interact as much as possible with these magnificent cetaceans. In addition, we will be looking not only for gray whales, but also for dolphins, sea lions, birds, and all the marine life that comes to surprise us.

If the group wishes, we can disembark at Isla Patos, a wonderful deserted dune that has become a bird sanctuary, where we can enjoy most of the species that live in the region.

In the mid-afternoon, we will return to the camp to enjoy the remaining daylight hours and the possibilities that the camp and the island offer us.

To end the day, we will enjoy the delicious culinary possibilities offered by the camp's restaurant in this special environment that the island provides.



DAY 4: SIGHTING AND RETURN TO CABO O LA PAZ

On the last day we will wake up early in the morning to have breakfast at the camp and we will leave as soon as possible to enjoy one last time this unique event that nature gives us at this time of the year.

We will look for the blows of these wonderful animals, and fight for that encounter of National Geographic's best documentaries with those gray whales that want to come closer to socialize with us. All this while paying attention to the rest of life that comes to say goodbye.

Once the activity is over and the group is satisfied, we will return to the camp to have lunch and pick up all our luggage to start our way back to the port of San Carlos.

There our transportation will be waiting to take us back to Cabo or La Paz after this incredible adventure.
